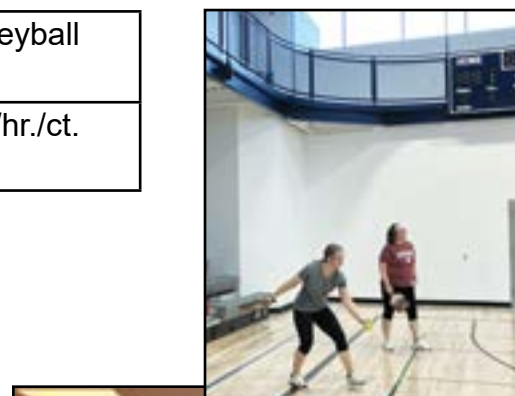

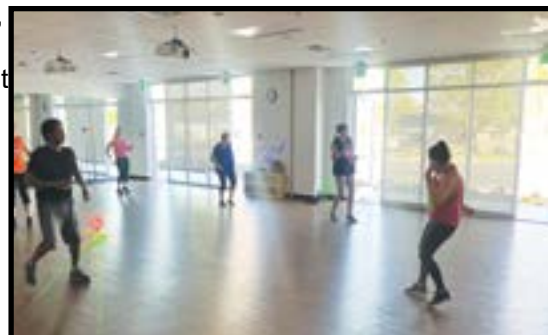

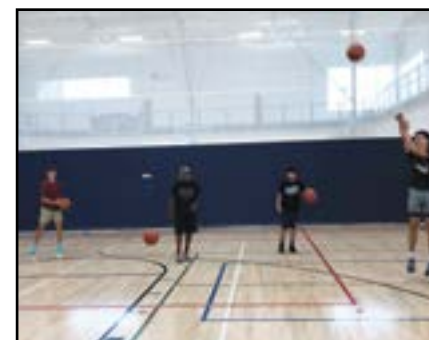

#### *Rainier Remembered: Views of the Early Decades* Traveling Exhibit from the Lee Silliman Print Collection

**Date:** Showing through October 27, 2023

**Location:** Main Gallery, 401 S. Balsam St.

**Featured Image:** *Rainier National Park* by unknown artist, 1938

This collection of vintage historic imagery focuses upon the pride of Washington State—Mount Rainier National Park, which was established as the nation's fifth national park in 1899. Through images and words, this exhibit explores the natural beauty, the human involvement, and the physical challenges of the Cascade Range's highest peak, which towers at 14,411 feet above sea level. The exhibit's memorabilia, dating from the 1850s to the 1940s, includes pre-park engravings, black and white silver gelatin photographs, hand-tinted photographic prints, colorful tourist album lithographs, magazine illustrations, promotional literature, and postcards. To paint the sweep of Rainier's past, historical commentary accompanies the images. In addition to stunning imagery of the peak itself, the exhibit includes pictures of hikers with alpenstocks challenging the mountain's rocks, glaciers, graceful waterfalls, old campgrounds, flowery meadows, and winter scenes.

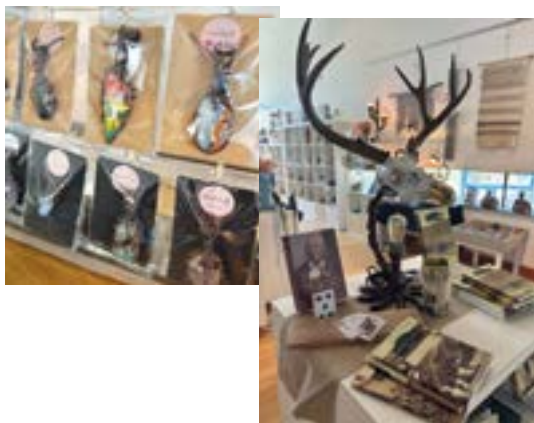

**Level 2** - Construct a Kimono (Japanese robe), learn to read patterns, lay out fabrics, finish seam allowance, learn the proper way to get your size through measuring yourself and sew five to six samples. Price includes pattern and sample fabric pieces.  
**Level 3** - Construct PJ's, learn to read the pattern, test your skill on measuring, do lay out of fabric and sew five to six samples. You will basically start this on your own with close supervision. We won't let you make costly mistakes; there will be parts needed for extra help. We want to make sure you have learned what you'll need to go out on your own.  
**Level 4** - You must have completely finished Levels 1 and 2 (kids must have completed Levels 1-3) before you can take this class. You will purchase your own pattern that involves a zipper and fabrics and construct a garment of your choice. You will learn different ways of putting in a zipper, elastic, cuffs and lining a pocket.

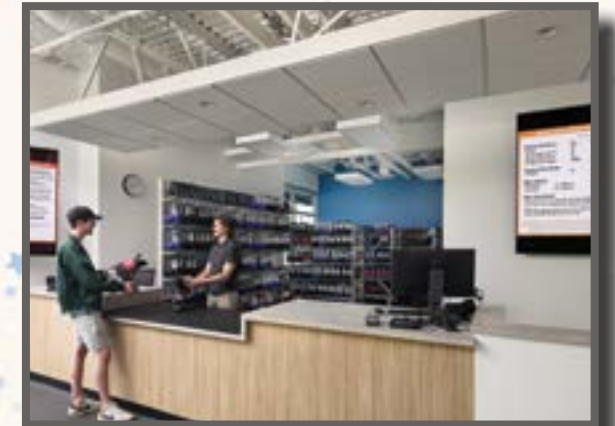
