

What to Do with Used Sharps

Sharps refer to: needles, syringes, lancets, auto injectors, including epinephrine and insulin pens, infusion sets, and connection needles/sets

Put sharps in a strong, plastic container like a laundry detergent or bleach bottle.

For Residential or Non Commercial Use: When the container is 3/4 full, put the lid on, and seal with duct tape. When full, these containers may be disposed in the household trash.

Homemade sharps containers may also be disposed at transfer stations, the Ephrata Landfill and drop box sites in Grant County. Normal fees apply.

When generated by a business, agency, or commercial enterprise, all biomedical waste, including sharps must be disposed of through a licensed biomedical waste transporter or an approved treatment method. Safe disposal of all biomedical waste is the responsibility of the business owner. This is true for businesses large and small, for-profit and non-profit.
