

Memorandum of Agreement

This Agreement made by and between the Director of Public Works/County Road Engineer, representing the Grant County Road Department, 124 Enterprise St. SE, Ephrata, WA 98823 and the Director of Municipal Services, representing the City of Moses Lake, 321 S. Balsam, Moses Lake, WA 98837, and

Whereas, Grant County and the City of Moses Lake respectively desire to cooperate in mutually beneficial activities, and

Whereas, Grant County desires to reclaim and fill an excavated portion of its Road District #2 Shop facility located at 12171 Rd. 3-NE, for beneficial use, and

Whereas, the City of Moses Lake desires to have convenient locations to dispose of excess material from its maintenance and construction activities, now

Witnesseth:


Grant County and the City of Moses Lake agree to the following:

1. Grant County will allow the City of Moses Lake to dispose of excess materials at the District #2 Shop facility. This may be accomplished by City staff, or the site may be made available to contractors under contract with the City for a City project upon prior written approval from the County Road Engineer.
2. City of Moses Lake will coordinate these activities directly with the Road District #2 Supervisor for site access and disposal location.
3. Acceptable materials will be limited to the following:
 - a. 12-inch-minus native soils consisting of GW, GP, GM, SW, SP, SM, or ML as designated by the Unified Soil Classification System. Soils shall not contain high levels of organic material.
 - b. 2-inch-minus HMA or BST grindings.
 - c. 6-inch-minus Rubblized PCC without reinforcing steel.
 - d. City of Moses Lake shall make all reasonable efforts to ensure that soils contaminated with petroleum products or other readily identifiable contaminants do not get transported to the County shop site.
